INTRODUCTION



Welcome

This directory is designed to make sure that you clearly understand local services and how to access them.

It gives details about specialist services for children with a disability and about general services for all children.

We hope that you find the information in the directory useful.

We would like to acknowledge the assistance of Health Service Executive staff and other organisations who were involved in developing the directory.

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Public Health Nursing

Description of services

The public health nursing service carries out developmental examinations five times during a young child's life. These examinations happen at the following stages:

- at birth;
- at 3 months;
- between 7 and 9 months;
- between 18 months and 2 years; and
- at 3 to 4 years.

If there is a concern about a child's development during any of the developmental examinations, the nurse will refer your child to another service, for example the Area Medical Officer, a speech and language therapist, a GP and so on. Once your child is in school, they are offered sight and hearing tests in senior infants and 6th class.

Referrals

All public health nurses are notified of all births in their area through the maternity hospitals and will visit you at home as soon as possible after you leave hospital. You can refer yourself to the public health nurse by calling at your local health centre.

Community Health Doctor

(Formally Senior Area Medical Officer)

Description of service

The Community Health Doctor provides a community-based service to children aged 9 months to 13 years. The services include:

Developmental clinics

Special clinics are provided for children aged from 9 months to 1 year. At these clinics, children are assessed for all aspects of development such as physical ability, behaviour, hearing, sight and so on.

School assessments

This service, for children aged up to 13, assesses children for difficulties such as failure to thrive, growth disorders, hearing and sight problems and so on.

Child immunisations

BCG clinics are held once a month.

Medical assessments and advice

Community health doctors assess people's health for certain social welfare benefits such as Mobility Allowance and for motorised transport grants and disabled drivers' tax.

Health promotion talks

Community health doctor give talks in schools and pre-schools for parents, teachers and children.

Referrals

Referrals and access to these services are through public health nurses, GPs and, sometimes, school principals. If a child is in care, referrals are made by social workers.

Speech and Language Therapy Service

Description of service

- assesses, diagnoses and manages the treatment of speech, language and communication difficulties with children aged up to 18;
- involves others in treatment, for example family members, teachers, carers and so on, to make sure the therapy is as complete as possible;
- provides a specialist service during the school terms for children who are in special education in four classes within local mainstream schools; and
- provides a service to some children within a language class in a mainstream school, for example St. Marnock's National School in Portmarnock.

Referrals

Anyone involved with the child can, with the parents' consent, refer them to the service. Please note that if a child is attending another service for speech and language therapy (for example with a voluntary organisation), they cannot avail of this service.

Community Occupational Therapy

Description of service

The occupational therapy service provides the following:

Generic services

This is an occupational therapy service for children with a physical disability (and their carers) to help them achieve the best possible level of independence within their community. The children receive the service in their home.

Referrals

Referrals can be made by hospital medical staff, public health nurses, GPs, voluntary agencies, health and social care professionals. Individuals and families can also refer themselves.

Paediatric services

These are services that assess and provide therapy to children aged 12 years and under who have a non-specific diagnosis, a mild learning disability or dyspraxia (a developmental co-ordination disorder).

Referrals

A referral to the paediatric service can be made through the public health nurse, Area Medical Officer, GPs, consultant paediatricians and health and social care professionals. All referrals must be made with a completed referral form.

Early intervention

This service is available to children aged from 5 years or under. See 'Early Intervention Team' on p. x.



Community Paediatric Physiotherapy Service

Description of service

A physiotherapy service is provided to children aged 5 years or under who are living in the local area. The service deals with children experiencing delay in the development of their movement and muscles, which might be affecting their balance or the way they walk.

Physiotherapy assessment of the child involves assessing their quality of movements, movement restrictions, and how their bones are developing. Children will get the therapy they need and parents and carers will be given advice and help to carry on with exercises at home. The child's progress will be reviewed from time to time.

Referrals

Referrals are accepted from the primary care team and public health nurses, GPs and other health care professionals.

Community Psychology Service

Description of service

The psychology service assesses the development of children aged under 18 if needed. Services are provided to children with emotional and behavioural difficulties.

Referrals

Referrals can be made by a range of professionals, for example Area Medical Officer, public health nurse or GP service. Families can also refer tvhemselves to the service. A standard referral form must accompany the referral.

CHILD PROTECTION AND WELFARE SOCIAL WORK SERVICES

Description of service

Child protection and social work services are in place to help children aged under 18 who are not receiving enough care and protection. The opening hours of this service are 9.00am to 1.00pm and 2.15pm to 5.00pm, Monday to Friday.

The service includes:

- child protection and family and risk assessment;
- family support; and
- assistance in fostering and adoption.

The service mainly identifies children who are not receiving proper care and attention will respond appropriately to these situations. At times, this may involve seeking emergency, interim and full-care orders as well as supervision orders if it thinks a child is at serious risk of assault, ill-treatment, neglect or sexual abuse.

The HSE recognises that parents, as the main carers for children, are central to child protection.

Referrals

Anyone who has a concern about the safety or welfare of a child can contact the duty social work team.

Primary Care Team [PCT]

The local health office of Dublin North proposes developing 30 primary care teams within eight health and social care networks covering the area.

Description of service

The primary care team consists of public health nurses, registered general nurses, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, speech and language therapists, social workers, addiction services professionals, community mental health nurses, nurses from the intellectual disability services and participating GPs.

The team aims to provide each person living in the catchment area with easy access to services that lead to improved health and well-being for everyone.

Services include assessment, diagnosis and treatment, rehabilitation, personal social services and health promotion.

Referrals

Referrals can be made through any member of the primary care team in your area. You can also refer yourself to this service.

Disability Services within the HSE

(a) Disability Manager

Description of service

The role of the disability manager in Dublin North is to make sure that people with physical, sensory and intellectual disabilities receive a service suitable to their needs within available resources. The disability manager works with voluntary agencies and private providers.

(b) Assessment Officer

Description of service

The assessment officer role was created under the Disability Act 2005. The 'assessment of need' process is available to children aged under 5 who might have a disability.

When the assessment officer receives an application, they meet the family and look at existing reports to find out whether a child is eligible for assessment. If they are, the child will be assessed by various therapists from places such as St Michael's House and the Central Remedial Clinic or by the Early Intervention Team or Primary Care Team within the local health office.

Assessments must begin no later than three months after the assessment officer receives the completed application form. They should also finish no later than three months after they start. When the assessments are complete, the assessment officer writes a report on all the findings. This report is forwarded to the case manager or liaison officer, who will complete a service statement for the child.

Referrals

A referral to the assessment officer can be made by parents, a professional already working with the child or a relative or guardian. All referrals must be made with a completed application form.

c) Case Manager and Liaison Officer

Description

The case manager's work includes:

- taking on a case load from the disability manager and co-ordinating each child's case;
- meeting with service providers, the professional team and the family to establish what services the child needs; and
- finding and dealing with suitable services to help meet the needs of the child.

The liaison officer's work includes:

- accepting the assessment report and identifying the services already in place;
- identifying other services required to meet the child's needs;
- planning the services with the service providers
 (as much as resources will allow) and writing up
 the service statement to forward to the family and
 service provider; and
- reviewing the case within an appropriate timeframe and taking note of any gaps in the service.

d) Early Intervention Team [EIT]

Description of service

The Early Intervention Team is a community-based team of professionals who assess and help children aged 5 or under who may have delayed development or disabilities.

Between them, the team offer speech and language therapy, physiotherapy, psychology, occupational therapy and social work services. They work with existing services to make sure the child's needs are met. To qualify for the services of the EIT, a child must:

- live in one of the areas covered by the team,
- require at least two kinds of therapy, and
- not qualify for any other specialist services.

Referrals

With the consent of the family, a child and parent can be referred to the Early Intervention Team by any health professional.

Ophthalmology Service (eye care)

Description of service

An ophthalmology service is provided to all primary school children in the Dublin North Central, North Dublin and North West Dublin areas. A range of eye tests and treatments are provided to meet the child's eye care needs.

Children who start receiving eye treatment before while in primary school will continue to receive it when they leave.

Secondary school pupils who have a medical card will be eligible for eye care services. Children who don't have a medical card will not be eligible for this service.

Referrals

Referral for this service are through public health nurses, GPs or a children's hospital.

Audiology Service (hearing)

Description of service

The audiology service is available to all children from birth until they complete full-time education, regardless of their family's financial situation. The service provides amplification devices (hearing aids) to people with a hearing impairment and gives advice and information to help them overcome or reduce the effects of their hearing difficulties.

Services include:

- hearing tests;
- fitting of hearing aids;
- reviews of the effectiveness of the hearing aid, for example by monitoring the child's speech and language and general progress at school;
- technical support and repairs for hearing aids that were provided by the audiology service.

There is a walk-in service between the hours of 9.30am to 12.30pm and 2pm to 4.30pm in North Great Georges Street. A postal service is also available.

Referrals

As a parent or guardian, you must give your consent before a child is referred to the audiology service. Referrals can be from medical practitioners, public health nurses, community health doctor and other healthcare professionals. Ideally, children should have had a medical examination before being referred to the service.

Family Centre

Description of service

The Family Centre provides a broad range of support, counselling and therapy services to help children and their families reach their full potential. The service is available to children aged up to 18. Most of the work takes place in the Family Centre, but it can also take place in the family home if necessary. Each Family Centre has qualified professionals on the team to help parents and children to address their problems.

Services include:

- individual, family and group counselling,
- bereavement and loss support,
- parenting support,
- behaviour management,
- dealing with separation issue
- support for alcohol and/or other substance misuse, family violence and so on.

Referrals

Referrals can come from healthcare professionals and social workers, other organisations or families themselves.

CHILD AND ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES (CAMHS)

Mater CAMHS Ballymun

Description of service

The Mater Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS) Ballymun is part of the Mater Misericordiae University Hospital's community-based child and adolescent mental health service. One team – Team A - operates in Dublin North Central and a small section of Dublin North West (contact details at the end of this section).

This service is currently available to children aged 16 or under who have ongoing mental health problems that affect their day-to-day living and relationships and prevent them from getting on in school.

Examples of these kinds of problems include:

- depression and low mood;
- anxiety or worries;
- behavioural difficulties;
- developmental difficulties;

- Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD);
- psychosis (losing touch with reality);
- self-harm;
- eating problems including anorexia nervosa and
- bulimia; and
- family relationship difficulties.

Services offered at the Mater CAMHS include psychiatry, clinical psychology, social work, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, art therapy and family therapy.

Referrals

Referrals are accepted from a variety of medical, educational and community services personnel for example, public health nurses, GPs, primary care team, paediatricians, school principals, preschool managers, educational psychologists, child protection social workers and so on. Referral forms are available from the administrative assistant.

Central Remedial Clinic

Description of services

The Central Remedial Clinic is a national day care centre for the care, treatment and development of children with physical disabilities up to age 18.

It provides a wide range of services, including assessment, diagnosis and treatment of children with a wide range of physical conditions.

Services offered include:

- physiotherapy,
- occupational therapy,
- seating and mobility,
- clinical gait analysis (study of how a child walks),
- speech and language therapy,
- nutrition and dietetics,
- nursing,
- educational technology,
- assistive technology,
- social work,
- psychology,
- medical and orthopaedic services,
- home respite services, and
- clinical feeding and swallowing assessments.

The CRC has a school on campus for children aged up to 18.

Referrals

Referrals come from childcare professionals and are made to the medical director of the clinic. If the child is already attending another service, that service should be named in the referral letter. Referrals are decided on at weekly meetings and, if appropriate, initial assessments are arranged with families.

St Joseph's Centre for the Visually Impaired

Description of service

St Joseph's Centre provides education and training for blind and partially-sighted children from birth through to young adulthood. Through education, training and social care, the centre aims to provide students with the knowledge, skills and confidence to reach their full potential and make their own life choices. St Joseph's Centre is open to families from all over the country.

The centre provides the following services:

- assessment of the needs and abilities of a child or young person with sight loss;
- early intervention service and pre-school, to provide specialised support and skills to children and their families from birth to 6 years;
- St Joseph's Primary School, a school with a special curriculum for pupils with a visual impairment;
- secondary education in Pobalscoil Rosmini, a school that educates visually impaired and sighted students together;
- occupational therapy and speech and language therapy for pupils in St Joseph's school and mainstream schools that helps them to set their individual goals;
- eye clinic an ophthalmologist (eye specialist) from Temple Street Children's Hospital links in with St Joseph's once a week;

- vocational training for visually impaired young adults aged 16 and over who are likely to have recently completed the special education cycle in secondary school and have additional needs;
- group housing, on campus and in the local community, for all students who avail of St Joseph's service to help them be independent in everyday life;
- St Joseph's Family Resource Centre (FRC), which offers training, information, advice and other supports to families and children with visual impairments and other disabilities;
- horticulture and pet therapy, which gives visually impaired children the opportunity to explore and understand their environment and develop their self-confidence;
- a library and information service with detailed materials on all aspects of visual impairment that can be posted to families in remote areas; and
- training, research and development, which includes a wide range of workshops and seminars for professionals working with visually impaired children

Referrals

Referrals usually come from hospitals, a visiting teacher, a social worker for the visually impaired and schools. A family can also send in an application form to avail of St Joseph's assessment service.

Assessments occur only after referrals are received.

National Council for the Blind of Ireland

Description of service

NCBI is a not-for-profit charitable organisation that provides support and services nationwide to people experiencing sight loss. It also provides a range of services to public and private organisations to make sure that their services are accessible to adults and children who are blind and visually impaired. Their mission is to help people who are blind and vision impaired to become independent and participate fully in society. NCBI services are available to people of all ages.

Services provided within NCBI include:

- a community based service that provides emotional and practical support to people who are living with sight loss;
- rehabilitation and mobility training to help people with sight loss to lead independent lives by enabling them to carry out everyday tasks and move around safely and independently;

- an assessment and low vision service from an optometrist, who assesses a person's level of vision and recommends magnification aids that may open up new opportunities for reading, writing and other daily activities.
- a library that provides Braille, large print and talking books;
- advice on assistive technology such as magnification and speech computer software to make information accessible;
- advice on employment, from procedures for job applicants to career advancement as well as advice on workplace adaptations;
- professional and peer counselling through a team of trained counsellors who have personal experience of sight loss; and
- resource centres that provide a range of activities, including computer training, fitness classes and art.

Referrals

Referrals can come from individuals, family, friends and relatives as well as from health care professionals.

St Joseph's Adolescent Unit

Description of service

St. Joseph's is a school for boys with a hearing impairment. It provides a range of educational programmes at primary and secondary level to promote all aspects of personal development.

Classes in the primary section aim to follow the curriculum used in mainstream national schools. Secondary students follow mainstream academic and vocational programmes.

The school recognises the right of each pupil to be educated through the means of communication that suits them best.

St Joseph's also offers the service of a full-time home/school liaison person as well a psychologist, audiologist and counsellor.

St. Joseph's caters for day pupils and boarders. Residential pupils stay in six modern houses on the campus and travel home at weekends and for school holidays.

Referrals

Referrals can come from parents or professionals.

The child must meet the entrance criteria, one of which is that there is a level of deafness in both ears.

DeafHear

Description of service

Deaf Hear is a voluntary organisation providing services to deaf or hard of hearing people and their families. It aims to help people to make the most of their opportunities and participate fully in society.

The services available through DeafHear include:

- support and counselling by social workers and family counsellors to deaf and hard of hearing people, parents of deaf children and deaf parents;
- DeafTech, a technology service that can benefit deaf and hard of hearing people greatly in their day-to-day lives; e.g. telephone amplifiers and television listening devices
- specialist information about hearing loss, advice about rights and entitlements and help with accessing other community services;

- hearing and communication therapy, which provides a range of supports and programmes to help people develop new coping skills, including lip reading skills, and build their confidence and self-esteem when they acquire hearing loss;
- information and advice on social welfare rights and entitlements and links to Citizens Information Services; and

St Michael's House

Description of services

St Michael's House provides a lifelong service in the Dublin area to children and adults with a moderate, severe or profound intellectual disability and to their families. Professional services include physiotherapy, social work, occupational therapy, paediatrics, speech and language therapy, psychology and home teaching. Dietetics and psychiatry are available on referral.

The services provided by St Michael's include:

- early services (0 6 yrs) and pre-school support;
- special schools, including services for children with severe and profound disability;
- support for children in mainstream schools;

- respite and some residential services for children;
- host family respite projects;
- LINK and Daybreak programmes, which involve one-to-one and group activities for children outside of school hours;
- limited services to children with a diagnosis of intellectual disability and autism.

SERVICES FOR AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDERS

Beechpark Services (HSE)

Description of service

Beechpark Services provide health-related supports to children aged up to 18 who have a specific diagnosis of autistic spectrum disorder (ASD) but no significant intellectual disability. The children normally attend pre-school and primary school classes in mainstream schools.

Beechpark Services covers the regions of Dublin, Wicklow and Kildare and provides an early services team for children aged under 6 years in Dublin Mid Leinster.

Services provided include:

- clinical support to two special schools for children with ASD at Ballyowen Meadows and Setanta School in Stillorgan;
- clinical support to a number of applied behaviour analysis (ABA) facilities across its region;

- training for parents and other professionals and support groups for parents and other family members;
- respite care when it is needed in the Dublin North East area (through St Paul's, Beaumont); and
- home support for families when they need it.

Referrals

Referrals are made to the admissions committee in Beechpark Services' Tallaght office (see address below). Referrals must include a copy of the diagnosis of autistic spectrum disorder and a psychological assessment stating that the child has no significant intellectual disability. The referral letter and reports can be forwarded by parents or professionals. The admissions team meets every two weeks to decide on referrals.

St Paul's Services

Description of services

St Paul's provides specialist services for autistic children aged 4 to 18. The services are available to families living in the three community care areas of Dublin North Central, Dublin North West and Dublin North.

The services provided by St Paul's include:

- St Paul's Special School, a special national school for children from 4 -18 years of age;
- St Paul's Hospital, which provides residential services and therapy for children up to 18 years of age;
- a respite service, which is offered separately to children aged 5 to 12 (junior respite) and aged 13 to 18 (senior respite) and is available also to children with autism who attend other services in the three community care areas;
- a transition service called Community House, which aims to prepare children aged 12 to 18 for adult services and equip them with skills to lead independent lives; and

- support from a team of professionals with expertise in
 - psychiatry,
 - psychology,

 - teaching (including special needs assistance).
