<u>Doctor Visit Card increases to thresholds from the 1st April 2019.</u>

I refer to the announcement by the Government as part of Budget 2019 to revise the GP Visit Card Thresholds with effect from 1st April 2019. The revised thresholds will apply to all cohorts. Please see the table below providing details of the increases per family unit:
